Teaching and Learning Expectations

- Your child will be encouraged to:
 - Ask for help
 - Contribute to class discussions
 - Make the most of all learning time
 - Reflect on their learning
 - Be honest
 - Give it a go Don't be scared to make a mistake (I will!!!)
- Every minute matters There will be purposeful work from 8:30 every day.
 - We aim to make your child's learning Happy, Safe and Fun

Teaching and Learning Expectations (continued)

- In year 3 your child will develop confidence and independence.
- This will enable the children to take responsibility for their own learning.

 The year 3 teaching staff will provide 100% commitment to helping your child grow both academically, socially and emotionally. (Developing the whole child)

Curriculum for Autumn Term

- Autumn Year 3 Topic From Stone Age to Iron Age
 This supports and leads our learning in many
 subjects where appropriate (Geography, History,
 Music etc.....)
- Maths and English is taught every morning.
- 'Rich Texts' for the Autumn term will be The Boy with the Bronze Axe & The Iron Man.
- The children will be taught a full curriculum of Science, French, PE, PSHE, Geography, History, Music, Art&DT, Computing and RE

Curriculum for Autumn Term

- Some foundation subjects may be taught as a block during one week (eg Computing). This enables the safe use of equipment and for our bubble to be Covid safe.
- Later year 3 topics will include Beautiful Britain and The Romans.

Helping at Home/Homework

- Homework will be set on a Monday and returned the following Monday.
- Reading, Times Tables and a set English or Maths task will be set each week.
- The Maths/English task will be practise of recent learning and nothing too lengthy. (approx. 20 minutes)
- Reading Ideally 20 mins a day (or at least 4 times a week) really helps with development of vocabulary. Some reading to your child counts towards the minutes. Hearing fluent reading helps.
- Times tables knowledge underpins so much maths teaching and there is an expectation that the children are fluent in 2,3,4,8,5 & 10 by the end of Year 3

Helping at Home/Homework

- Homework will not be set during school holidays.
- Don't have long battles with your child if they refuse to do homework. Send it in uncompleted and I can discuss with them in class.
- Be picky attention to detail is vital. Ensure capital letters and full stops are used correctly.
- Mistakes are fine and help the teacher see where a child needs support.
- Don't try and teach your child a method you were taught.
 Let them do it their way. It avoids confusion and keeps things as simple as possible to aid learning.

Helping at Home/Homework

Finally, one of the most important things you can do is to praise your child's effort.

Positive praise and encouragement really helps a child want to learn.

They do and will work hard in school (I have seen that already).

Let's work as a team to help them be the best they can.
